

EXAMPLE OF ANALYSIS

INDIAN CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

18. Place of institution of suit where local limits of jurisdiction of Courts are uncertain:

(1) Where it is alleged to be uncertain within the local limits of the jurisdiction of which of two or more Courts any immovable property is situate, any one of those Courts may, if satisfied that there is ground for the alleged uncertainty, record a statement to that effect and thereupon proceed to entertain and dispose of any suit relating to that property, and its decree in the suit shall have the same effect as if the property were situate within the local limits of its jurisdiction : Provided that the suit is one with respect to which the Court is competent as regards the nature and value of the suit to exercise jurisdiction.

RE-WRITING OF SUB- SECTION (1) OF SECTION 18 WITH FINITE VERBS *(replacing of participle to relative clause)*

Where it is alleged

That will be uncertain within the local limits of the jurisdiction

Of which of two or more Courts any immovable property is situate,

Any one of those Courts may record a statement to that effect,

If court is satisfied

That there is a ground for the alleged uncertainty

And court may dispose of any suit

That relates to that property

And, its decree in the suit shall have the same effect

As if the property were situate within the local limits of its jurisdiction:

On condition that the suit is one with respect

To which the Court is competent as regards the nature and value of the suit

To exercise jurisdiction

SENTENCE ANALYSIS OF SUB-SECTION (1) OF SECTION 18

MODIFIERS IN SECTION: Noun, Verb, Prepositional, Infinitive and Participle phrases

CLAUSES IN SECTION: There are thirteen clauses

1. Where it is alleged (*Subordinate clause*)
2. That will be uncertain within the local limits of the jurisdiction (*Subordinate clause*)
3. Of which of two or more Courts any immovable property is situate (*Subordinate clause*)
4. Any one of those Courts may record a statement to that effect (*Independent clause*)
5. If court is satisfied (*Subordinate clause*)
6. That there is a ground for the alleged uncertainty (*Subordinate clause*)
7. And court may dispose of any suit (*Independent clause*)
8. That relates to that property (*Subordinate clause*)
9. And, its decree in the suit shall have the same effect (*Independent clause*)

10. As if the property were situate within the local limits of its jurisdiction
(Subordinate clause)
11. On condition that the suit is one with respect *(Subordinate clause)*
12. To which the Court is competent as regards the nature and value of the
suit *(Subordinate clause)*
13. To exercise jurisdiction *(Subordinate infinitive clause)*

CLASSIFICATION OF SENTENCE: It is a complex-sentence with one independent clause and fifteen subordinate clauses)
