

EXAMPLE OF ANALYSIS

BANGLADESH PENAL CODE, 1898

36. Effect caused partly by act and partly by omission

Wherever the causing of a certain effect, or an attempt to cause that effect, by an act or by an omission, is an offence, it is to be understood that the causing of that effect partly by an act and partly by an omission is the same offence.

RE-WITING OF SECTION 36 WITH FINITE VERBS *(replacing of To-infinitive to relative clause)*

Wherever the causing of a certain effect

Or whenever the causing of an attempt

To cause that effect, by an act or by an omission

It is an offence,

It will be understood

That the causing of that effect partly by an act and partly by an omission is the same offence

SENTENCE ANALYSIS OF SECTION 36

MODIFIERS IN SECTION: Noun, Verb, Prepositional, Infinitive and Gerund phrases

CLAUSES IN SECTION: There are six clauses

1. Wherever the causing of a certain effect (*Subordinate gerund clause*)
2. Wherever the causing of an attempt (*Subordinate gerund clause*)
3. To cause that effect, by an act or by an omission (*Subordinate infinitive clause*)
4. It is an offence (*Independent clause*)
5. It will be understood (*Independent clause*)
6. That the causing of that effect partly by an act and partly by an omission is the same offence (*Subordinate gerund clause*)

CLASSIFICATION OF SENTENCE: It is a compound-complex-sentence with two independent clauses and four subordinate clauses.
