

EXAMPLE OF ANALYSIS

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH, 1972

46. Power to provide indemnity

Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Part, Parliament may by law make provision for indemnifying any person in the service of the Republic or any other person in respect of any act done by him in connection with the national liberation struggle or the maintenance or restoration of order in any area in Bangladesh or validate any sentence passed, punishment inflicted, forfeiture ordered, or other act done in any such area.

STEP-1

RE-WRITING OF ARTICLE 46: *(by indentifying finite verbs, non-finite verbs, finite phrases, non-finite phrase, finite clauses, non-finite clauses, and punctuation marks; expanding and replacing finite phrases into finite clauses and non-finite active and passive phrases into finite active clauses and passive into finite passive clauses)*

Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Part, Parliament may by law make provision for

Indemnifying any person in the service of the Republic or any other person in respect of any act

Which is done by him in connection with the national liberation struggle.

Or which is done by him in connection with the maintenance

Or which is done by him in connection with the restoration of order in any area in Bangladesh

Or Parliament may by law validate any sentence passed, punishment inflicted, forfeiture ordered, or other act

Which is done in any such area.

STEP-2

ANALYSIS OF ARTICLE 46

MODIFIERS IN ARTICLE: noun, verb, prepositional, infinitive and Gerund phrases

CLAUSES IN ARTICLE: There are seven clauses

1. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Part, Parliament may by law make provision (*Independent clause*)
2. For indemnifying any person in the service of the Republic or any other person in respect of any act (*Subordinate gerund clause*)
3. Which is done by him in connection with the national liberation struggle (*Subordinate clause*)
4. Or which is done by him in connection with the maintenance (*Subordinate clause*)
5. Or which is done by him in connection with the restoration of order in any area in Bangladesh (*Subordinate clause*)
6. Or Parliament may by law validate any sentence passed, punishment inflicted, forfeiture ordered, or other act (*Subordinate clause*)
7. Which is done in any such area (*Subordinate clause*)

STEP-3

CLASSIFICATION OF SENTENCE: This is a complex-sentence with one main clause and six subordinate clauses. All subordinate clauses are coordinating with main clause and related to one another)
