### **PAKISTAN CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1898**

#### **ORIGINAL TEXT FOR LITERAL OR GRAMMATICAL INTERPRETATION**

##### **91. Power to take bond for appearance:**

When any person for whose appearance or arrest the officer presiding in any Court is empowered to issue a summons or warrant, is present in such Court, such officer may require such person to execute a bond, with or without sureties, for his appearance in such Court.

#### **CONTEXTUAL INTERPRETATION OF CLAUSES IN SECTION 91**

1. when any person is present in such Court (*Adverb clause of place, modifying, "may require" in 3*)
2. for whose appearance or arrest the officer presiding in any Court is empowered to issue a summons or warrant (*Adjective clause, qualifying, "any person" in 1*)
3. such officer may require such person to execute a bond, with or without sureties, for his appearance in such Court. (*Main clause*)

**CLASSIFICATION OF SECTION 91:** It contains one main clause and two subordinate clauses
